Ministerial Matters

Grace, mercy, and peace to you, from God our Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Dear friends,

I wonder if you have enjoyed the change of seasons as we have moved from the end of the summer months into Autumn. This year I have been in complete awe of the autumnal colours on the leaves of the trees. In particular, I have greatly enjoyed the colour of the cherry blossom trees - of the orange pink colour of their leaves contrasted by the dark bark of the tree trunk. There have been wonderful light displays in the sky as the sun has pierced through the heavy thick, dark clouds of rain. I have enjoyed seeing the sun rise and set - a consolation for the fewer hours of daylight that we now have at this time of the year.

As the seasons change, it occurred to me that this wonderful feast for the eyes is a natural sign of the spiritual life. The jaunty colours of the autumn leaves mean a dying of the leaf. Gradually they have fallen and now the trees are bare. But we know that the trees will not always be bare, because spring will soon be on the way.

This natural process is a beautiful image of the spiritual

life. In the spiritual life, death always gives way to new life. There is no better example of this than in the passion and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus came to die in order to win for us eternal life, so that when we die to this earthly life we rise in glory in our eternal home. The dark empty tomb gave way to a beautiful garden on a warm spring morning.

The turning point in Winter is of course Christmas – when the world turns towards spring. C.S Lewis once described hell as a place that is "always winter, but never Christmas." At Christmas we remember that Jesus came into the world to set us free from darkness and death. He has promised to abide with us even to the end of the age.

This means that when situations seem bleak and dark, we remain a people of hope. The light of the world, our Lord Jesus Christ is with us – and the darkness will never extinguish his light. As the Psalmist writes in psalm 23 -

'even though I walk in the shadow of death' the lord is always our shepherd leading and guiding us. We were not made for darkness or death but for life in all its abundance.

The Church of Scotland seems to be going through its own

seasonal change. We have been in a time of autumn and winter for some time – but soon spring will be on the way, and it is our hope that we will see the first green shoots of new life across the Kirk. We continue to work towards the implementation of the presbytery's mission plan which will eventually see Cairnlea, Calderbank, Chapelhall and Clarkston unite together. But this is likely to take some time and so in the meantime. Clarkston Church is very much open and full of life – whether that be in our Sunday Worship, our warm space café, our Messy Church, or in the many acts of service and kindness shown by our members.

I am especially grateful to all of those who have worked so hard to renovate the hall to make it a base for mission in the Clarkston community. We will have an opportunity to celebrate this work, to say thank you to all involved, and to dedicate the renovated hall to God's glory at a special café-style service in the hall on Sunday 7th December.

When it comes, I hope you have a wonderful Christmas.
